

Grievance Process

- 1. Claimant emails a written grievance request to our office manager at info@embodywise.com Grievance requests should include claimant's name, phone number, email address, full grievance details and reparation requested.
- 2. Embodywise's office manager and/or assigned staff member researches and clarifies the facts of the grievance request with all involved parties while ensuring the claimant's confidentiality.
- 3. Office manager works out a resolution that is mutually agreeable to the claimant and Embodywise's director within 60 days after receipt of the claimant's written grievance request.
